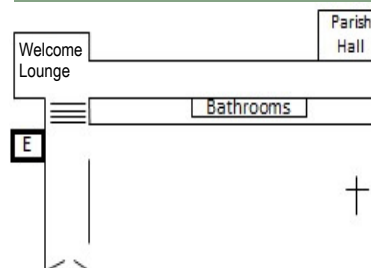

If potty-trained & 3 yrs of age, parents may decide to move their child up to the Children's Music Program.
