John for Everyone – DID YOU NOTICE? In 18:28-19:30 we reach the traditional "passion" narrative. Jesus comes before Pontius Pilate and then comes the cross. This is that "hour" Jesus cryptically talks about at several different places earlier in the text -- his moment of glory. He admits to Pilate to that he is a king, but his kingdom is not of this world (go back to the prologue!) We see here, at the cross, the continuing work of the Heavenly invasion: the eternal Word of God (Jesus) is raised up to draw all peoples to himself. For next week, try reading 19:31-20:23. There are only two weeks left for our parish-wide immersion! We wrap up on May 27.


