**Sunday, 8:00 a.m.** Rite I Holy Eucharist with organ music offers the most traditional worship experience.

**Sunday, 10:30 a.m.** A lively Rite II Eucharist draws on the rich heritage of the Hymnal and Book of Common Prayer. St. George's Choir sings September through May. Children aged three through 5th grade have Sunday School during the first half of the service. The classes for Middle School, High School and adults meet at 9:30 a.m.
