Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in his life in Christ?

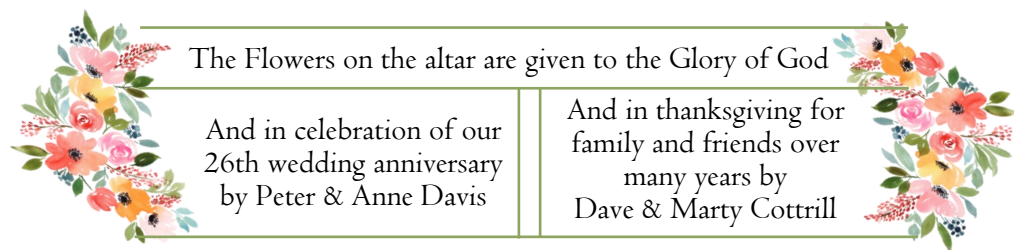
